

PRACTICE *verb* to practice something is to do it often so that you get better at it.
PRACTICE *noun* practice is doing something often and regularly so that you get better at it.

Yes, you guessed it! The past three weeks our class worked on **HOMOPHONES**.

Homophone

a word that sounds like another word but has a different meaning and a different spelling.

The children learned a set of words each week. They identified the differences in spellings and found words that rhyme. They used the words correctly in sentences. They could also detect wrong spellings and how a word made the sentence meaning change.

Yay!

This week, we officially started division! We have been **PRACTIC**ing dividing in hundreds, tens, and ones. The children are familiar with the terms “quotient” and “remainder.” They have been **PRACTIC**ing the Multiplication tables which help them with the division steps. We have also been **PRACTIC**ing inverse operations to check answers to the calculation. Your child will be **PRACTIC**ing long division in their homework this week.

This week, we wrapped up the Early Explorers topic. We will begin with the new science topic: **Space** next week. I have assigned some cool and interesting books and interactive videos about space on RazKids. I would like to encourage the children to read as often as they could.

The more one reads, the better reader one becomes!

I must say that our class is ready for the Thanksgiving show. I believe the children have filled you in where you should be seated at the theatre! The children have performed tremendously well at the **PRACTICE**. I am very proud of the children and their effort.
